NORTH OGDEN CITY OFFICIAL GENERAL BALLOT AND VOTING LOCATIONS

I, S. Annette Spendlove, North Ogden City Recorder, hereby give notice in accordance with 20A-5-101(4) of the Utah Code for the General Election to be held on November 8, 2011, for all eligible registered voters.

Persons wishing to vote must be 18 years of age and a registered voter in North Ogden City at least 30 days prior to the election.

All voters are required to present valid voter identification. To view valid forms of voter identification, view our website at www.northogdencity.com on the home page click the elections tab. Voters who do not have identification with them can cast a Provisional Ballot and then present valid voter identification to the county clerk within five business days after the election.

If your name or address has changed, you will be required to vote a Provisional Ballot and will have to show proof of residency for the new name and/or address. Questions contact the City Recorder at 801-737-9830.

SNOW REMOVAL HELP - Many of your friends, family members and neighbors are older, temporarily or permanently disabled and need your help when it snows. If you are willing to help your neighbors, let them know. Give them your phone number and tell them to call. If you are one of the residents that are in need of assistance, talk to your neighbors, know the phone numbers to your local church leaders and scout masters.

How Snow Is Removed From City Streets:

Again, the Public Works Department, along with the Police and Fire Departments and the City Manager, have been working on preparation for this year's snow and ice removal. This article is to help us all better understand the procedure the City will be using. Because we do not know when or how much snow we will receive, we follow a basic plan for removal and adjust accordingly. If a storm hits during the night, the Police Department will call out the crew as needed. Obviously, certain streets of the City have a greater intensity of use and more snow than other streets; these have a higher priority for maintenance. A map of the City showing the route priority can be seen at the City Office or City Shops. We will plow the main routes first, school areas, bus routes, etc, then we will branch out into residential areas. It may be necessary to clear an area immediately for power outages, fire or ambulance calls, or other obvious emergencies.

We have eight sanders and it does take time to cover the entire City so we ask for your help in being patient and driving safely. As the plows cover the City it will take the plow at least three passes on each street to clear the snow back to the curb. Please be patient in clearing your driveways. When clearing your driveway, please put the snow on the right side of your driveway so when the plows do come by they will push the snow away from your driveway.



We especially want to draw your attention to the busy intersections throughout the City. Please be extremely cautious when approaching them. Slow down ahead of time, even if your lane has the right-of-way. Your caution while traveling these and all areas of the city is very important for your safety. We understand that snow removal is a very time consuming and frustrating task, not understanding the snowplow driver's intentions may add to that frustration. If you have any questions on how we do snow plowing or sanding, please call Mel Blanchard at 801-782-8111. The snowplow drivers cannot stop plowing to handle concerns unless an emergency occurs. So all questions and concerns will be turned over to Mel or the police officer on duty.

We will do our best to serve you and make North Ogden City a safe winter community. Thank you for your support and caution.

A FEW MORE TIPS ON SNOW REMOVAL:

We begin plowing snow when there is an accumulation of 3" or more. For those storms that are less than 3" we will salt the main road, large hills and school zones only. With a storm that lays down 3" of snow and then stops it will take approximately 8 hours for the plows to clear the snow from every area in the City but if the snow continues beyond 3" the time is increased roughly 2 hours per inch. Please know that we are doing our best to meet the snow removal needs of the city as quickly as possible.



Please be patient in clearing your driveways and do not put your snow in the roadways as this creates a road hazard. When clearing your driveway, please put the snow on the right side of your driveway so when the plows do come by they will push the snow away from your driveway. Additionally, please remember there is no parking on any city street from midnight to 6:00 am or within 24 hours of a snowstorm.

We ask your help in being patient and driving safely. Please be sure that your vehicles have proper maintenance and that you decrease your speeds.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

Winter is quickly approaching and leaves are falling everywhere. Homeowners need to be sure to pick up the leaves in their yards so they don't fill up the gutters and storm drains. Also trees need to be trimmed over the streets, sidewalks, and gutters to a height of 9 feet. In regards to the planting of trees in the park strips – the park strip is the area between the back of the curb and the sidewalk. Homeowners are supposed to obtain permission from the City Forester prior to planting trees in the park strips. Trees should not be planted in the parking strip closer than 50 feet from the intersection of street property lines. This prevents a traffic hazard at intersections so drivers are able to see on-coming traffic. The City Forester has a list of approved trees which may be planted in the park strips. Remember camper trailers, motorhomes, boats, and other recreational vehicles and trailers may not be parked in the front yard. They may be parked in the side yard and must be located no closer to the front property line than 10 feet in front of the front wall plane of the home and entirely on the owner's property. They must also be parked on concrete, asphalt, or pavement bricks. If you don't meet these requirements please find a storage facility to store your rv's, boats, or trailers. Also remember that the winter parking regulations go into effect November 15th. As you plan for the upcoming holidays, please take the time to assure your home and belongs will remain safe as well. If you intend to travel during the holiday season, take precautions ahead of time to keep your home safe. North Ogden has had several residential burglaries in recent months. These crimes have generally occurred while the residents were away from home. If you plan to go out of town for the holidays, talk to trusted neighbors and let them know of your plans, and ask them to watch your property while you are gone. Also give them a cell phone number or other number where you may be reached in an emergency. Your neighbors know better than anyone else what is normal or unusual activity around your home. Encourage them to contact the police immediately if they see anything suspicious. Park a vehicle in the driveway, as well, and keep lights on in the house. These steps will make your home look occupied and less tempting for criminals.

As you prepare for Christmas, do not store presents in your car as you shop, and do not display wrapped presents near a window where they can be seen from outside. While this is a pleasant holiday display, it is also an announcement to thieves that you have nice things gift wrapped and ready to be stolen. The North Ogden Police Department also offers a vacation check service. Vacation check request forms are available on the North Ogden City web page or at our office. These requests notify our police officers and volunteers that you will be away, and they will make an effort to extra patrol your residence as time permits to make sure everything is secure. Finally, do not advertise that you will be away. Arrange to have your newspapers and mail cancelled or collected while you are gone, and do not announce on social media websites that you will be away. If your Facebook friends know you will be out of town, it also lets them know when your property will be unguarded. Wait until you get back to share the news of your trip. We hope you have a safe and happy Thanksgiving.
