

Subject: North Ogden City Water Hook-Up

Dear North Ogden City Council Members;

When North Ogden City increased the depth of the well at 800 East 2100 North around the year 2000 and subsequently surge tested the well for a period of time. The private wells in the vicinity no longer produced adequate water for a residential home. My home at 672 East 2100 North was one of those homes.

In discussions with the then City Manager John Hendricks he told me that if I would purchase from the city a hook up for \$1000.00 I could hook up any time in the future . I purchased the hook up.

After the city stopped surge testing their well the aquifer replenished and my well-produced adequate water once again. I had no reason to hook up at that time. My understanding was that I owned the hook up and could use it any time in the future.

Now it is 2014 and I would like to use the previously purchased water hook up at my 672 East 2100 North residence.

I have spoken with several city employees and they tell me the city records do not go back that far. Mayor Brent Taylor told me I would have to go to the city council for the authorization for North Ogden City to honor their commitment for my water hook up.

I cannot find my city receipt. My financial institution only keeps check records for seven years.

I hope the City Council will honor the agreement made with myself and North Ogden City and allow me to hook up to city water.
