### **MAYOR'S MESSAGE**

September was a fantastic month in North Ogden and for your city government! The North Ogden Police Department became one of the very first departments in the state to field body cameras on all patrol officers and detectives. By using forfeited funds from criminals, we were able to purchase 16 cameras with almost no taxpayer cost. This proactive step by our highly professional police department will serve the public interest and is a strong step for transparency and accountability. Weber Pathways announced approval for an additional 5.5 miles of trails on the east bench south of the North Ogden Canyon. Once finished, this will complete 27 continuous miles of trails along the Bonneville Shoreline!

We celebrated Constitution Day on September 17<sup>th</sup>, and thank the volunteers who lined Washington Blvd. and other areas in the city with flags to remind us how fortunate we are to live in a free country. We also completed a major re-surfacing project on Washington Blvd/400 E/450 E north of 2600 North. We are working hard to improve the condition of our roads. I am pleased to report that the City Council also approved funds to purchase a Crack Seal machine. Regular crack seals of a road will lengthen the lifespan and is a critical aspect of road maintenance. By owning the machine, we will be able to self-perform our own crack seal operations at a much lower cost than contracting the service, and we will be able to accomplish more road maintenance for the same tax dollars. Our North Ogden float and royalty won the "Most Peachy" award in the Brigham City Peach Day Parade. Lastly, the new Public Works Facility is moving forward on-time and within budget. The building foundations have been poured, and it is on schedule to be completed this winter.

We would like to wish everyone a happy and safe Halloween. To help assure the safety of the children and others who plan on celebrating the holiday, we would like to remind residents of a few safety precautions:

- Trick-or-Treat with a parent, older sibling, or other trusted adult. Do not go alone, and do not run ahead of your group.
- Assure that costumes include light colored or reflective material.
- Carry a flashlight.
- Cross the street at the corner, and look both ways to make certain traffic is aware of you and has stopped before you enter the roadway. Do not enter the roadway from between parked vehicles.
- Only Trick-or-Treat from residents you know, and do not go into residents' homes without having a parent or other trusted adult with you.
- Only Trick-or-Treat from homes that have a porch light on.
- Be careful around animals, even your own. Animals may become frightened by the unusual costumes and activities, and they may not recognize the person wearing the costume.
- Do not tamper with, break, or destroy people's decorations. This includes pumpkins. Damaging or destroying other people's decorations is a crime, and we want Halloween to be a fun and safe holiday for everyone, including those who would like to put up decorations.
- Have your parent inspect your treats before you eat them to assure that they are safe for you to eat.



North Ogden has started accepting dog license renewals for 2015. Licensing fees are as follows:

- \$5.00 for spayed/neutered with microchip
- \$10.00 for spayed/neutered without microchip
- \$20.00 for unaltered with microchip
- \$30.00 for unaltered without microchip

\*\*\* In addition to the above licensing fee, North Ogden City has assessed a \$5.00 surcharge for each license to help pay for construction of the new dog park.

As a reminder, households are permitted a maximum of two dogs per residence. Additional dogs are only allowed at residences that have been granted a kennel permit by North Ogden City.

**SNOW PLOW SAFETY**

When traveling on roadways during the winter months, it's important to keep snow plow safety strategies in mind.

**\*Snow Plow Safety Tips for Drivers** – Snow plows tend to travel at a lower rate of speed than other vehicles, so be sure to slow down if you see one in front of you. The snow plow may also need to stop more frequently than other drivers to make sure that the lights on it are free from snow and ice. Do turn your lights on so the snow plow operator can see you. You should have your headlights on even during daylight hours. If you are attempting to pass a snowplow, avoid doing so on the right-hand side. When the snow plow is being operated, the snow and any debris the blade picks up will be deposited on the right side. When a snow plow is being driven, it can create a snow cloud behind it. Drivers should avoid following the snow plow too closely, since the cloud of snow can interfere with visibility.

**\*Snow Plow Safety and Children** – Children need to understand snow plows are very large and they take time to slow down and stop. However, it may be difficult for children to hear a snow plow approaching, and they should move well back from the road if they see or hear one. Playing near roadways is not the safest choice in the winter. Children can fall onto the roadway in the path of an approaching snow plow, and the results can be tragic. Building snow forts near the street is also unsafe. A snow plow operator will have difficulty seeing children if they are hidden from view while playing behind or under a pile of snow. Snow plow safety is something everyone who is on or near roadways should be aware of. The operators are performing a necessary function, and if they are able to focus on their work without distractions the process will run smoothly.



During winter, snow will fall and travel will become more challenging. The dedicated men and women of our Public Works Department will be out in force keeping our roadways as clean and safe as possible. We would like to remind everyone to use extreme caution around the plow trucks and to utilize the information below. Our Public Works Department has an excellent safety record, and you can help us continue to provide safe and effective snow removal by following these tips. **Safety Tips and Guidelines**

**Please make sure you are at a safe distance when pulling out in front of a plow truck** - Our trucks can weigh in excess of 10 tons and require a longer than normal stopping distance on slick pavement.

**When following a plow, allow plenty of stopping distance** - Plow trucks make frequent stops and back up with little warning. Remember, if you cannot see a plow truck's side view mirrors, the driver cannot see you.

**Remain at a safe distance from rock salt** - Rock salt is our main defense against slick pavement and our plows are capable of spreading this salt in a 20-foot pattern behind the vehicle. We do use shielding to deflect this pattern, but occasionally rock salt can damage nearby vehicles or come in contact with pedestrians.

**Please do not pass plow trucks** - Please take a few minutes and allow us to clear your path

**When Is Parking on Streets Not Allowed?** – From November 15<sup>th</sup> through March 15<sup>th</sup> of each year there is no parking on the streets from midnight to 6:00 a.m. There is no parking on the streets and roadways anytime during a snowstorm or within 24-hours following the cessation of a storm. Cars, trucks, trailers or other vehicles parking on the streets or roadways against these rules are considered a public nuisance and may be towed at the registered owners expense.

**Why Does My Driveway Get Plowed In?** – The snowplows are designed to direct snow to the curbside of the plow blade. These side-delivery plows are the fastest and most efficient means available to remove snowfall from the streets. As a result, snow is discharged along the length of the curb, the parkways, and the private driveway areas. There are thousands of private driveways city-wide, and cleaning these off is the responsibility of the owner. To ensure both the streets and your driveway are cleared efficiently, please follow these guidelines:

**\*Pile your snow to the right side of the driveway** - This will help alleviate the amount of snow that is piled at the end of your driveway after plows pass through.

**\*Wait till your street has been plowed before clearing your own driveway** - This will prevent your own snow piles from being piled back onto your driveway.

**\*Don't discharge your snow into the streets** - Ordinance prohibits this. Snow may freeze or become compacted, creating a safety hazard for all motorists. Homeowners may be held liable for damages caused by this road hazard or may be fined for causing the hazard.
