

### MAYOR'S MESSAGE

October was a fantastic month for North Ogden. Our City obtained \$2.2 million dollars in grants from Weber County to assist in the future widening of 400 E/450 E north of 2600 North and for the future construction of Skyline Blvd. along the north end of the City. We are pursuing all possible county, state and federal grants to assist with major upcoming projects, in order to be able to accomplish these projects for less North Ogden tax dollars. The City Council and staff are working very hard to plan for needed future roadways in our city, and we will be discussing this more in public Open House events starting in January. We will be beginning a process to update our City's General Plan ("Master Plan"), and we want your input on how to improve traffic in our City and how to finance future roads. I want to thank everyone who is helping our City reach our Sales Tax and Recycling goals. As of Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>, we are at 74% for Sales Tax and 72% for Recycling. If we all think a little more about shopping local and a little more about using our blue cans for recyclable materials, together we can hit 100% or higher for both goals. Please help keep our taxes low by shopping in North Ogden and by recycling as much as possible! The new Smith's Marketplace will be opening on November 19<sup>th</sup>, and this will be a great addition to North Ogden's business community! Great things are happening in North Ogden and your public employees are hard at work to serve our city. Happy Fall everyone!




#### Please Shop Local

**MOTOR HOMES, BOATS, CAMPERS & TRAILERS**

City Code: 11-10-22, requires that all motor homes, boats, campers and trailers must be parked to the side of your home on a hard surface (cement or pavers). The tongue or front of the motor home may not extend more than 10 feet past the front plane of the house. These vehicles and trailers may not be parked in the street more than two days at a time. As your City Code Enforcement Officer I will be coming around during the next month or two contacting those residents who are not in compliance with this section of the City Code. If you do not have adequate parking for your trailer/motor home, you will need to find available space at another location. If you have any questions, please contact Mike Mellor at 801-737-2218. Ready or not, winter season is just around the corner. We would like to remind everyone that North Ogden has a Winter Parking ordinance, which prohibits parking on any public roadway between midnight and 6:00 A.M. between November 15<sup>th</sup> and March 15<sup>th</sup>. Motorists are also prohibited from parking on a public roadway during or for 24 hours after a snow storm. This ordinance allows snow plows to safely remove snow from our streets. It is also unlawful to fail to promptly remove snow from a public sidewalk in front of your property, or to discharge snow from your property onto a public roadway. Also, as you prepare your property for the winter months, we encourage residents to make sure that lawn movers, bicycles and other outdoor equipment are put away and secured for the season. This is an excellent opportunity to take an extra moment and make note of the makes, models and serial numbers of all of your belongings, both inside your house and outside. Store this information in a safe location, off-site if possible, whether in a safe deposit box, at work, or with a trusted family member. This information is invaluable in the event your property is stolen, and can often be the information needed to assist the police in apprehending suspects and getting your property back to you in the event it is stolen. It is also helpful information when filing insurance claims in the event of damage or theft. If the property does not have a serial number listed, mark or engrave it with a personal identification number such as your phone number, address, or driver’s license number (please, do not use your Social Security Number). Then, store these numbers as you would the serial numbers. We thank you for helping keep our community safe for both yourselves and others, and we hope you have a safe and enjoyable holiday season.



During winter, snow will fall and travel will become more challenging. The dedicated men and women of our Public Works Department will be out in force keeping our roadways as clean and safe as possible. We would like to remind everyone to use extreme caution around the plow trucks and to utilize the information below. Our Public Works Department has an excellent safety record, and you can help us continue to provide safe and effective snow removal by following these tips. If you have questions, or concerns, please contact the Public Works Department at (801) 782-8111.

**Safety Tips and Guidelines**

**Please make sure you are at a safe distance when pulling out in front of a plow truck** - Our trucks can weigh in excess of 10 tons and require a longer than normal stopping distance on slick pavement.

**When following a plow, allow plenty of stopping distance** - Plow trucks make frequent stops and back up with little warning. Remember, if you cannot see a plow truck's side view mirrors, the driver cannot see you.

**Remain at a safe distance from rock salt** - Rock salt is our main defense against slick pavement and our plows are capable of spreading this salt in a 20-foot pattern behind the vehicle. We do use shielding to deflect this pattern but occasionally rock salt can damage nearby vehicles or come in contact with pedestrians.

**Please do not pass plow trucks** - Please take a few minutes and allow us to clear your path

**When is parking on streets not allowed?** – From November 15<sup>th</sup> through March 15<sup>th</sup> of each year there is no parking on the streets from midnight to 6:00 a.m. There is no parking on the streets and roadways anytime during a snowstorm or within 24-hours following the cessation of a storm. Cars, trucks, trailers or other vehicles parking on the streets or roadways against these rules are considered a public nuisance and may be towed at the registered owner's expense.

**Why does my driveway get plowed in?** – The snowplows are designed to direct snow to the curbside of the plow blade. These side-delivery plows are the fastest and most efficient means available to remove snowfall from the streets. As a result, snow is discharged along the length of the curb, the parkways, and the private driveway areas. There are thousands of private driveways city-wide, cleaning these off is the responsibility of the owner. To ensure both the streets and your driveway are cleared efficiently, please follow these guidelines:



**\*Pile your snow to the right side of the driveway** - This will help alleviate the amount of snow piled at the end of your driveway after plows pass through.

**\*Wait till your street has been plowed before clearing your own driveway** - This will prevent your own snow piles from being piled back onto your driveway.

**\*Don't discharge your snow into the streets** - Ordinance prohibits this. Snow may freeze or become compacted, creating a safety hazard for all motorists. Homeowners may be held liable for damages caused by this road hazard or may be fined for causing the hazard.
