MAYOR TAYLOR'S MESSAGE

May was a great month for North Ogden! I am pleased to report that the City Council unanimously approved a Public Works Facility project and budget, and Groundbreaking is scheduled for June 3rd. The new facility will be located at 220 E. Pleasant View Dr., a few blocks west of the current facility. The approved budget is \$2,951,847 for construction plus a contingency, and we have selected Lundahl Building Systems of Logan as the contractor. North Ogden taxpayers will receive an incredible facility, including: a 21,000 square foot steel shop building with drive-thru bays and 3,500+ square feet of bonus mezzanine storage, a separate 5,000 square foot masonry office building with a bonus 5,000 square foot basement for vehicle parking, a salt/sand shed and external storage area, paved road access to both Pleasant View and Lomond View Drives, a fuel station, a 5 ton crane, and much more (see full details at the city website). This will be a fantastic facility at an incredible value, and will not use any bonds or loans to achieve. It represents months and years of hard work by the City Council, Public Works Committee, and city staff. We recognize the work of past and present city leaders who have contributed to this project, even if on different sides of the debate. This project divided our community, but now it is time for us to come back together and all rally around a great project at a great price that will move our city forward.

I am also pleased to welcome Phillip Swanson as the newest member of the North Ogden City Council. During the May 13th City Council meeting, Councilman Swanson was selected from among seven outstanding and highly qualified applicants to fill the Council seat vacated when Councilman Justin Fawson resigned to fill the open District 7 seat in the Utah Legislature. Representative Fawson gave dedicated service to North Ogden and we honor his time on the City Council and wish him the very best in the Legislature as he continues to represent North Ogden.

Lastly, the City Council will be discussing and approving the annual City Budget on June 10th at 6:30 PM in the City Offices (505 E. 2600 N.). Please come and learn about your city budget and provide your input! --Mayor Brent Taylor

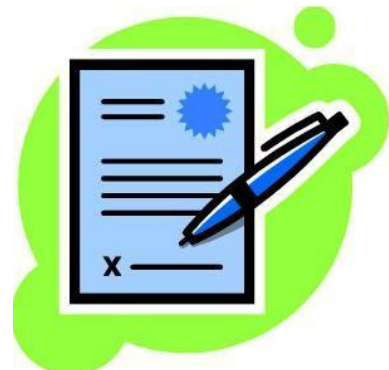


FLOOD PLAIN INFORMATION

The North Ogden Police Department frequently receives complaints from citizens who have been solicited or fallen victim to fraudulent activity, or they have already responded to the fraudulent offer and have lost substantial amounts of money as a result. There are numerous methods used by criminals trying to take advantage of unsuspecting victims. One method is you are informed you have won the lottery, but are asked to send the required administrative fee to an office in order to receive the award. Another common scam is someone calls claiming to be a family member or friend in distress and is in need of money, then asks you to wire money to a distant location. A different scam involves receiving a check with a request to cash the check and keep a portion of the money for yourself after you've sent the remainder back to them in the form of a money order.

If you have received any of these or similar offers by email, phone or mail, be aware that they are part of a scam and that someone is trying to steal your money. There are resources available to assist you. The FBI, National White Collar Crime Center, and the Bureau of Justice Assistance have joined forces to investigate and address cyber-crime. If you feel someone is trying to scam you over the Internet, visit <http://www.ic3.gov/>. There is a simple form that you can fill out to report fraudulent activity. Also, if you feel you have been a victim of fraudulent activity or want to know what you can do to reduce your chances of becoming a victim of fraud, you may also visit the State of Utah Department of Commerce http://commerce.utah.gov/releases/14-03-03_dcp-top-ten.pdf.

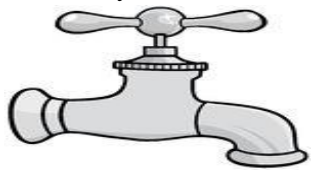

Water Conservation Tips – Water conservation measures are an important first step in protecting our water supply. Such measures not only save the supply of our source water, but can also save you money by reducing your water bill. Here are a few suggestions.

Conservation measures you can use inside your home include:

- Fix leaking faucets, pipes, toilets, etc.
- Replace old fixtures; install water-saving devices in faucets, toilets, and appliances.
- Wash only full loads of laundry.
- Do not use the toilet for trash disposal.
- Take shorter showers.
- Do not let the water run while shaving or brushing teeth.
- Soak dishes before washing.
- Run the dishwasher only when full.



You can conserve outdoors as well:

- Water the lawn and garden in the early morning or evening.
- Use mulch around plants and shrubs.
- Repair leaks in faucets and hoses.
- Use water-saving nozzles.
- Use water from a bucket to wash your car, and save the hose for rinsing.

Household Hazardous Waste Program

The household hazardous waste program is for all Weber County residents. The program is FREE for household quantities of hazardous waste. Small business owners may be assessed a fee depending on quantities brought in. The hours and months of operation are every 3rd Saturday of the month beginning in April and ending in October. Hours of operation are 8am-1pm. For more information please call 801 399-8803. We encourage residents to take advantage of our FREE re-use center as well. The re-use shed contains used paint, thinners, approved pesticides and other misc. used products brought in by the public.
