### UTILITY RATES INCREASING BEGINNING JULY 1, 2013

The City Council passed the Fiscal Year 2013-2014 budget on June 11, 2013 which included a rate increase for several utilities. The rate increases were approved to help offset rising costs and to also save for future capital projects (i.e. replacement of utility lines, wells, equipment etc). The following are the rate increases which were approved:

- Water - \$.49
- Sewer - \$3.94
- Storm Drain - \$.26

The total increase will be \$4.69 per month and the increase will appear on the bill received in August. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the City Offices at 801-782-7211.

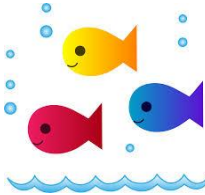

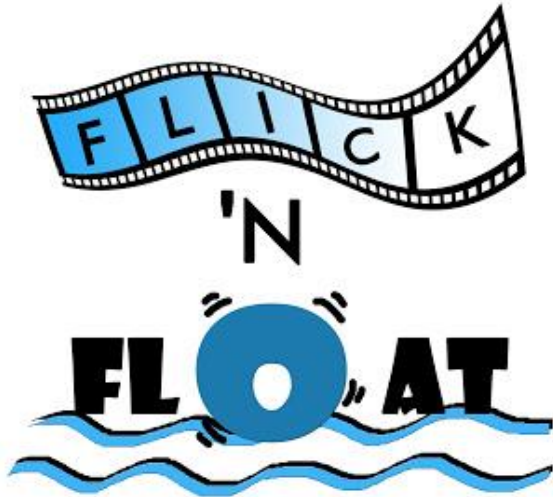

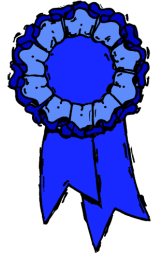

# MUNICIPAL ELECTION 2013

## NORTH OGDEN CITY OFFICIAL PRIMARY BALLOT AND VOTING LOCATIONS

I, S. Annette Spendlove, North Ogden City Recorder, hereby give notice in accordance with 20A-5-405 of the Utah Code for the Primary Election to be held on August 13, 2013 for all eligible registered voters. Persons wishing to vote must be 18 years of age and a registered voter in North Ogden City at least 30 days prior to the election. All voters are required to present valid voter identification. To view valid forms of voter identification, view our website at [www.northogdencity.com](http://www.northogdencity.com) on the home page click the elections tab. Voters who do not have identification with them can cast a Provisional Ballot and then present valid voter identification to the county clerk within five business days after the election. If your name or address has changed, you will be required to vote a Provisional Ballot and will have to show proof of residency for the new name and/or address at that time. For questions, please visit our website or contact the City Recorder's Office at 801-737-9830.

Any registered voter in North Ogden City can vote at any one of the three locations listed.
