This month we are busy as well, working on finalizing a new General Plan for North Ogden. A city's General Plan (or "Master Plan") is the single most important document in a city, and sets an overall vision and plan for future commercial and residential development, roadways, parks, trails, etc. Our current General Plan has served us well for many years and was developed by visionary past leaders, and we are looking to build on their efforts as we update the General Plan. Over the past 8 months we have been gathering your input and ideas for North Ogden's future through surveys and by holding Open House events. We have had well over 1,000 people participate in the General Plan process, which is simply incredible and I am pleased to report that our draft General Plan is now complete. I invite you to take a look at the plan posted at www.northogdencity.com and to send us any final input and feedback you have on the plan. The City Council will be taking input through late August, and will be looking to adopt the final General Plan in early September. I want to give a special thank you to our wonderful committee of citizen volunteers who have served on the General Plan Steering Committee. I am confident that this new plan will build on North Ogden's rich past to lead our city into the future.

It's almost time to start the new school year. We would like to take this opportunity to remind motorists that there will be an increase in pedestrian traffic as children begin their annual trek to school, and to remind motorists, pedestrians and other citizens of a few rules to keep our community safe:

MOTORISTS:

- The speed limit in a school zone with flashing yellow lights is 20 mph.
- Motorists must stop for the crossing guard anytime he/she is in the crosswalk and the stop sign visible, regardless of which side of the road the crossing guard is on.
- When approaching a stopped school bus from either direction that has its red lights flashing, motorists must stop and remain stopped until the lights stop flashing and the bus is moving.
- Pedestrians have the right of way in a crosswalk.
- Do not stop at the red curb to pick up, drop off, or wait for students.
- When backing out of your driveway, check to make certain there are no pedestrians behind your vehicle before proceeding. Stop prior to the sidewalk to check for pedestrians.
- When stopped at an intersection, stop behind the white "stop" line or crosswalk. If there are no markings on the roadway, stop far enough back from the intersection to allow for pedestrians to cross safely in front of your vehicle.

PEDESTRIANS:

- Do not enter the roadway until you know motorists are aware of your presence and are stopped.
- Cross at the crosswalk, not mid-block. Do not cross diagonally.
- Use pedestrian indicators (flashing lights, orange flags, crossing guard, etc.) where ever they are available.
- Do not run out from between parked or stopped cars.
- Wear bright or reflective clothing when walking before the sun rises or after dark.
- Walk on the sidewalk wher ever possible. If there is not a sidewalk, walk single file on the shoulder of the road in the direction facing traffic. Do not walk in the travel lane.

PROPERTY OWNERS:

- Keep trees and other shrubbery trimmed back and away from traffic regulatory and advisory signs (stop signs, pedestrian crossing signs, speed limit signs, etc.)
