MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Budget Town Hall Meeting: You're Invited!

Please join the North Ogden City Council for a Budget Town Hall meeting to see the proposed North Ogden 2015-2016 budget and to provide your input. Under Utah law cities operate on a budget year that runs from July 1st to June 30th, and we are currently preparing the budget that will go into effect this summer.

Please come learn about your city budget and provide your input on

the choices the City Council is considering. The Town Hall meeting will begin with an Open House style format from 6:30 to 7:30, followed by budget presentations and a Town Hall meeting at 7:30. Myself and the City Council will answer your questions and share our vision for the city in the coming year. There is no proposed property tax increase this year (North Ogden is going on 6 straight years without a

property tax increase), but there are some proposed increases to utility rates to cover future infrastructure costs and to avoid bonding. We are also considering a \$3 per month "Transportation Utility Fee" on the utility bill to pay for road improvements and avoid bonding in the future for roads. Please come and learn about these and other proposals and provide your input to the City Council. ***I hope to see you there!***

ANIMAL CONTROL

There is usually an increase in animal related calls to the police and animal control during the summer. More people keep their windows open to stay cool, and as a result, barking dogs in the neighborhood become more noticeable. If your dog barks when outside, please bring it in. Also,

remind children as they are outside playing, to keep your dogs secured by a fence or leash. Remember that your dog, which is friendly towards your family and other people, may not be so friendly around strangers. Please keep your dog, as well as other people and animals in your

neighborhood safe by keeping your pet secure. If you would like to allow your dog to run off-leash, and you don't have a suitable yard, we encourage you to take advantage of the new dog park at the corner of 850 E. 2600 N.

Summer is upon us, and with it, we regularly see an increase in criminal activity. Here are a few tips to reduce the likelihood of becoming the criminal's next victim.

- Secure bicycles, lawn mowers, and other items of value when not in use. It only takes seconds for a thief to walk off with your valuables.
- Do not keep wallets, purses and other items in your vehicle where they are easy targets for criminals.
- Lock your vehicles. Thieves often roam neighborhoods searching for unlocked cars and trucks, and then rummage through unsecured vehicles for items they can steal.
- Record the serial numbers of all valuables, and if there is not a manufacturer's applied number, engrave one of your own. These numbers are often necessary to match recovered stolen property with their rightful owners.
- If you are going out of town, request that the police do vacation checks of your property. Forms are available at the North Ogden Police Department, 515 E. 2600 N. during regular business hours.

NORTH VIEW FIRE

Just a reminder that the open burning season is now over during the summer months. However, as the weather warms up and more of us are spending time outdoors we would like to remind everyone of the rules for having a recreational fire pit.

Recreational fires, such as fire pits, are allowed within North Ogden City limits. There are some regulations that must be met in order to use and conduct a recreational fire.

Recreational fires must be kept under 3-foot diameter and the wood pile no higher than 2-feet in height.

Recreational fires are NOT to be conducted within 25 feet of a structure or combustible material.

These fires are to be constantly attended by a person 18 years of age or older.

There must be a bucket of water, a hose or other means to extinguish the fire nearby.



The fire must be used solely for cooking, or other recreational purposes. Ensure that the wood burned in a recreational fire is clean and dry.

NO TRASH OR YARD WASTE will be allowed to be burned in a recreational fire.

Portable outdoor fireplaces are also allowed to be used within North Ogden City and are to be used in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions and follow the same regulations as a recreational fire.

Any fire larger than the 3-foot diameter as described above is considered a bon fire and can only be conducted with a written permit from the Fire Department.

North Ogden City Utility Rate Payers,

In accordance with Utah Code 10-6-135, a public hearing will be held on Tuesday June 16th, 2015 in the North Ogden City council chambers. The purpose of the hearing is to receive public comment on the charges and interfund transfers for utility services for city office buildings, parks and aquatic center. Anyone with concerns is welcome to come and comment at the public hearing.

An interfund transfer is a flow of assets to another fund without an equivalent flow of assets in return and does not require repayment. For example, transfers include water, sewer or storm water services provided by a utility fund to the general fund for utility services at city office buildings, parks and aquatic center.

The total estimated cost of the transfer from the utility funds to the general fund is \$17,536.12. A breakdown is detailed below:

City Buildings – \$4,530.79 per year

(City Hall, Police Station, Parks & Recreation Office, Public Works Office/Shop and Senior Center):

Water - \$ 946.68
 Sewer - \$1,302.00
 Storm Water - \$2,282.11

Park & Park Restrooms - \$7,763.38 per year

Water - \$1,115.28
 Sewer - \$1,562.40
 Storm Water - \$5,085.70

Aquatic Center - \$5,241.95 per year

Water - \$2,801.64
 Sewer - \$ 693.11
 Storm Water- \$1,747.20

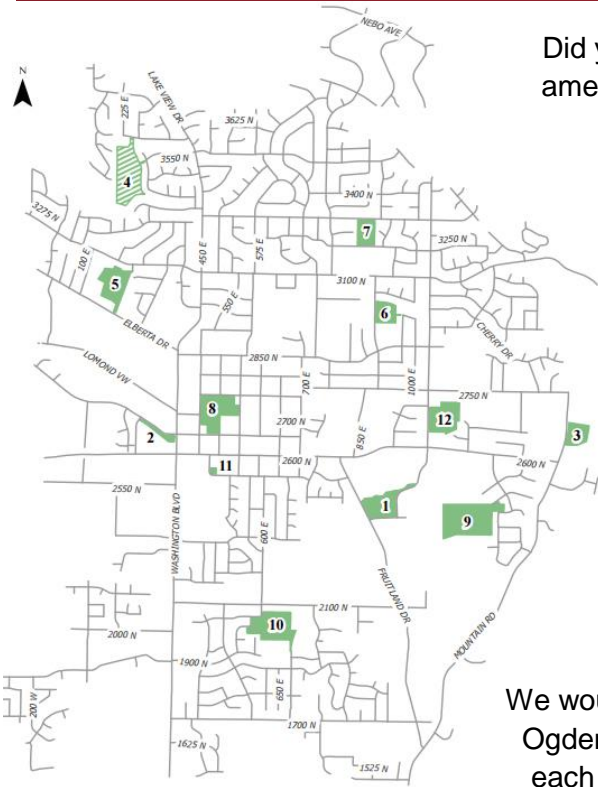

SPRINKLER SYSTEMS



North Ogden Parks and Recreation has 19 locations (parks, city offices and park strips) to be watered with sprinkler systems. There are over 30 time clocks at these locations, with 320 sprinkler zones and over 3,600 individual sprinkler heads. We use multiple types of sprinklers including the household-type “pop-up” sprinklers, commercial sprinklers and rotors, and drip systems to cover 62 acres of green space. Some of the large area rotors cover over 130 feet of grass with radial rotation and need to run for an hour to deliver the same amount of water it would take for the pop-up type sprinklers to deliver in 20-30 minutes.
