CHANGES TO THE OPEN BURNING LAWS FOR 2013

I, like many of you, am ready for spring to get here. I am ready for the cold frozen tundra of Northern Utah to begin to thaw. Many of you take advantage of our open burning season as a means to help clean up the yard. In the past this has been allowed in the cities of North Ogden, Harrisville and Pleasant View during the month of March. In the past you have simply been able to come into our station or to the city office building and fill out a permit. This is not going to be the case this year.

This year the Utah Air Monitoring Department has implemented some changes at the state level, which the public will be required to adhere to. The new dates for burning this year are going to be **March 30th - May 30th** in the spring and pending the approval of the Utah Air Monitoring Office a fall window from **September 15th - October 30th** may be implemented. As I mentioned before in the past the permitting has been done locally, this year that is not the case. All the permitting will be done online through the Utah Air Monitoring website. You will simply log onto their website which will be very user friendly and select the city you live in from a drop-down menu to fill out your application. It will then be sent as an email to our fire district and will be kept on file. There will be a list of rules that you can print off of the Utah Air Monitoring website after you fill out your application along with your permit application. There is no fee in obtaining a burn permit; however, you will be required to fill out a separate application for spring and fall seasons.

Another one of the major changes is on the day you would like to burn, you will be required to check the clearing and make sure that it is above 500. **If the clearing index is not above 500 no burning will be allowed.** Checking the clearing index can be done a couple of different ways: 1) by logging onto northviewfire.com, which will have daily updated clearing index conditions, 2) by calling Weber County Dispatch at (801)629-8221, or 3) by logging onto the Utah Air Monitoring website at www.airmonitoring.utah.gov

Just as in the past we will still have the authority to require extinguishment of the fire in cases where the smoke is becoming a nuisance to neighbors and if burning rules aren't being followed. If you have any questions you may call us at (801)782-8159.

GREEN WASTE FACILITY OPENING

The compost facility located at 2700 North and Mountain Road, will open on April 1, 2013.

The hours of operation are:

Mondays and Wednesday	3:00pm-6:00pm
Saturdays	9:00am-noon

It will be closed hunting season and all government holidays.

Green Waste passes will be sold to residents at the City Office. During office hours (8:00 am to 5:00 pm Monday thru Friday, except holidays) you may purchase a pass for \$25.00. The pass is good for 10 (non-consecutive) days.

ACCEPTED MATERIALS:

Woody Materials: vines, bushes, twigs, limbs, fitters and logs up to 12" in diameter. Stumps are not accepted.

Compost Materials: soft (non-woody), unbagged vegetative material (i.e. Grass clippings, leaves, pine needles, sawdust and shavings, weeds, farm animal manure).

Fill Materials: soil, rock, sod, brick, block, asphalt and concrete (prior approval needed).

Materials not specifically listed above will not be accepted. The woody tree material will be chipped or ground.

Wood chips and mulch items will be charged as defined in the consolidated fee schedule and on the sheet you were given when you purchased your punch card. You may pick those items up during the mentioned operating hours. Please obey all signage at compost facility to assure proper placement of items and assist in keeping the facility clean and organized. This program is operated entirely by volunteer residents of North Ogden. We thank the volunteers from last season and encourage you to be a volunteer this season. Without volunteers the facility doesn't operate.

GREEN WASTE PICK UP

The City has scheduled the spring Green Waste Pick Up for April 29 – May 3, 2013. Collection will be on your regular garbage day. The volume of material may, however, delay collection a day or two. The regulations mentioned below **MUST** be followed when placing material out for collection. All materials must be in boxes, bundled with string or bagged. Bush clippings and small tree limbs must be bundled and no longer than 5 feet in length. Weight limit is 75 pounds. Place materials in parkways, not in curb or waterways. **This is a Green Waste Clean Up Only. The compost facility is open at no cost this week from 8:00am to 4:00pm in addition to the regular volunteer hours on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday.**

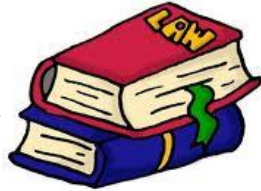
With spring approaching, we would like to take this opportunity to remind residents of some landscaping tips that will help keep your family, as well as others in the community safe. As you examine the trees around your yard, please make sure that when the leaves come out, the branches will not obstruct the view of speed limit, cross walk and stop signs. The State of Utah Traffic Code states:



“The owner of real property shall remove from his property any tree, plant, shrub, or other obstruction, or part of it that constitutes a traffic hazard by obstructing the view of an operator of a vehicle on a highway.” (Utah Code 41-6a-216)

As officers enforce traffic regulations in our neighborhoods, it becomes difficult to keep traffic flowing safely when the signs intended to advise motorists are hidden behind foliage. It could also open property owners up to liabilities should injuries occur due to signs hidden behind branches. If trees or other landscaping are deemed to be a hazard, the city could require, at the homeowner’s expense, the trimming or removal of the vegetation to alleviate the danger. We would like to add, however, that the city stepping in is only used as a last resort, and we ask residents to take it upon themselves to police their own property and remove the hazards so that our neighborhoods remain safe places for pedestrians and motorists.

On a separate note, there was a recent incident in a neighboring community where a resident came home to find his home had been burglarized, with one suspect apparently in the “get-away” vehicle and the other suspect exiting the victim’s home. This resident has a permit to legally carry a concealed firearm, and as the news outlets have reported, the homeowner reportedly fired upon the suspects as they fled the area. We understand that many residents of North Ogden own firearms either as a hobby or for protection, and we fully support their constitutional right to do so under the Second Amendment. Please be mindful, however, that firearms can only be discharged legally in defense of yourself or others (Utah Code 76-10-508.1). The law does not allow for their use in defense of property. Firearms are a valuable tool in self-preservation; however, we are not justified in the taking of one’s life in preservation of our television or CD collection.

OGDEN SKI RESORTS TO BE SERVED BY NEW SEASONAL BUS SERVICE

Ogden City and Weber County are pleased to announce a new agreement with the Utah Transit Authority to offer seasonal ski service to the greater Ogden area ski resorts. "This service highlights the accessibility of our resorts from downtown Ogden. It's an extremely inexpensive and convenient way to get out and play in our amazing backyard," said Mike Caldwell, mayor of Ogden City.

The service will provide a new transit option for residents and visitors to enjoy the area's ski resorts. It will be an opportunity for riders to save on gas money, escape winter driving conditions and avoid possible congestion in the canyon due to the water pipeline construction project. Service will originate from the Transit Center in downtown Ogden. First service for skiers departs as early as 7:55 a.m. Service will leave the mountains as late as 4:30 p.m. for Snowbasin and 9:36 p.m. for Powder Mountain. Riders should consult the official schedule at www.rideuta.com for specific weekday, weekend and holiday schedules. Fare is \$4.25 each way. Route connections in Weber County may be made at the following Ogden locations:

- Ogden Transit Center, 2350 S. Wall Avenue
- Lincoln Avenue and 24th Street
- Grant Avenue and 26th Street
- Washington Boulevard and 25th Street
- Washington Boulevard and 24th Street
- Washington Boulevard and 23rd Street
- Washington Boulevard and 22nd Street
- Washington Boulevard and 12th Street
- Rainbow Gardens, 1851 Valley Drive



Routes will then split to specific resort destinations:

Powder Mountain Resort

- Powder Mountain Park and Ride lot, Highway 158 in Eden (north of Valley Market)
- Wolf Creek, N. Wolf Creek Drive at the corner of Moose Hollow Drive in Eden

Snowbasin Resort

- Lakeside Resort Properties, drop and ride location, 6486 Utah 39 in Huntsville
- Chris' Cafe Park and Ride lot, 7345 east 900 south in Huntsville



Matt grew up in a pizza restaurant. Working with his Father they opened their first restaurant in 1982 in Delta, UT on Main Street. They named it "The Pizza House." It was in that small renovated house that Matt's dad developed the slow rising pizza dough used today to make Pizza Pie Café pizza so good. He combined high gluten flour and very little yeast to give the crust a rich flavor and chewy texture. The house has since been converted to a rental, but still smells like a pizza!

Matt's teen years included reading trade magazines and going to Pizza trade shows. At the age of 16 he read "Pizza Tiger", the story of Tom Monaghan and Domino's. Matt said, "I knew at that point that I wanted to open my own pizza restaurants and do that for the rest of my life."

Matt went on to work for various restaurants (too many to list) and in 1991 met his wife while working at "The Brick Oven" (Heaps) in Provo, UT. They married and Jane went to work for Olive Garden as their server trainer. They always wanted a restaurant of their own so in 2003 the couple moved to Rexburg, Idaho and took over an abandoned pizza shop. It was located across the street from BYU-Idaho, called Craigo's.

They put their talents to work creating Craigo's Gourmet Pizza. The building quickly became too small and in 2005 Craigo's moved locations in Rexburg and the community took notice. From humble beginnings as a college hangout, Craigo's became Pizza Pie Café and what you see today.
