MAYOR'S MESSAGE

New Business and Updates to the North Ogden Transportation Master Plan

Our economic development efforts are paying off, and I am pleased to announce that United Futsal (indoor soccer) has opened for business in the old Macey's/Carbon Fiber building, which has been vacant for almost 10 years. We are currently working hard of filling the old Smith's building, as well as other projects around the city. Our goal is to increase commercial development along Washington Blvd. and 2700 North, in order to increase sales tax revenues and keep property tax rates low.

Now that we have successfully updated our General Plan, we have begun the process to update the city's Transportation Master Plan. Past city leaders have shown incredible vision and foresight as they laid out plans for roads in our city. We hope to continue this as we look to update road and transportation plans for our city, including future road construction projects, road widening projects, and in identifying future road connections. Please attend an Open House event on Tuesday November 17th from 5:30 to 7:30 in the Senior Center to discuss transportation plans. Reminder to all residents, North Ogden City's Winter Parking ordinance goes into effect on November 15th. Please assist us in keeping the roads free of parked vehicles during this time period so that, in the event of snowfall, public works can effectively clear the roadways of snow.

7-3-4: WINTER PARKING REGULATIONS

It is unlawful for the owner of any vehicle to park his or her vehicle, or allow his or her vehicle to be parked, on any public street or roadway in the city between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight and six o'clock (6:00) A.M. from November 15 through March 15 of each year, except for physicians or emergency vehicles in emergency situations.



It is unlawful for the owner of any vehicle to park his or her vehicle, or allow his or her vehicle to be parked, on any public street or roadway in the city during any snowstorm or within twenty four (24) hours following the cessation of snow after any snowstorm.

Penalty: A violation of this section may be charged as a civil violation.

Removal: Any vehicle found parked in violation of this section shall be deemed a public nuisance and may be removed or towed away by or under the direction of the police department or the department of public works.

Adopted by Ord. 2010-11 on 10/12/2010

During winter, snow will fall and travel will become more challenging. The dedicated men and women of our Public Works Department will be out in force keeping our roadways as clean and safe as possible.

We would like to remind everyone to use extreme caution around the plow trucks and to utilize the information below.

Our Public Works Department has an excellent safety record, and you can help us continue to provide safe and effective snow removal by following these tips.

SNOW REMOVAL HELP

Many of your friends, family members and neighbors are older, temporarily or permanently disabled and need your help when it snows. If you are willing to help your neighbors, let them know. Give them your phone number and tell them to call.

If you are one of the residents that are in need of assistance, talk to your neighbors, know the phone numbers to your local church leaders and scout masters.

Safety Tips and Guidelines:

Please make sure you are at a safe distance when pulling out in front of a plow truck - Our trucks can weigh in excess of 10 tons and require a longer than normal stopping distance on slick pavement.

When following a plow, allow plenty of stopping distance - Plow trucks make frequent stops and back up with little warning. Remember, if you cannot see a plow truck's side view mirrors, the driver cannot see you.

Remain at a safe distance from rock salt - Rock salt is our main defense against slick pavement and our plows are capable of spreading this salt in a 20-foot pattern behind and to the sides of the vehicle. We do use shielding to deflect this pattern, but occasionally rock salt can damage nearby vehicles or come in contact with pedestrians.

Please do not pass plow trucks - Please take a few minutes and allow us to clear your path

When Is Parking on Streets Not Allowed?

From November 15th through March 15th of each year there is no parking on the streets from midnight to 6:00 a.m.

There is no parking on the streets and roadways anytime during a snowstorm or within 24-hours following the cessation of a storm

Cars, trucks, trailers or other vehicles parking on the streets or roadways against these rules are considered a public nuisance and may be towed at the registered owner's expense.



Why Does My Driveway Get Plowed In?

The snowplows are designed to direct snow to the curbside of the plow blade. These side-delivery plows are the fastest and most efficient means available to remove snowfall from the streets.

As a result, snow is discharged along the length of the curb, the parkways, and the private driveway areas. There are thousands of private driveways city-wide, and cleaning these off is the responsibility of the owner.

To ensure that both the streets and your driveway are cleared efficiently, please follow these guidelines:

Pile your snow to the right side of the driveway - This will help alleviate the amount of snow that is piled at the end of your driveway after plows pass through.

Wait till your street has been plowed before clearing your own driveway - This will prevent your own snow piles from being piled back onto your driveway.

Don't discharge your snow into the streets - Ordinance prohibits this. Snow may freeze or become compacted, creating a safety hazard for all motorists. Homeowners may be held liable for damages caused by this road hazard or may be fined for causing the hazard.

ANIMAL CONTROL

North Ogden has started accepting dog license renewals for 2016. Licensing fees are as follows:

- \$5.00 for spayed/neutered with microchip
- \$10.00 for spayed/neutered without microchip
- \$20.00 for unaltered with microchip
- \$30.00 for unaltered without microchip

*** In addition to the above licensing fee, North Ogden City has assessed a \$5.00 surcharge for each license to help pay for the new dog park. ***

As a reminder, households are permitted a maximum of two dogs per residence. Additional dogs are only allowed at residences that have been granted a kennel permit by North Ogden City.

1. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- a. Coops will be treated the same as accessory buildings but with the exception that on lots over one acre it must be twenty feet (20') from any neighboring dwelling (see site development standards and subsection 11-10-6C of this chapter regulations applicable to all zones).
- b. Feed must be stored in a rodent proof container.
- c. Clean water shall be made available to the Chickens at all times.
- d. Chickens must be housed in a covered, ventilated, and predator resistant coop.
- e. The coop must be located in the rear yard.
- f. The Chickens must be contained within the owner's property lines.
- g. If the Chickens have access to an outdoor run, the coop must have at least two (2) square feet per Chickens.
- h. If Chickens stay in the coop at all times, the coop must have at least six (6) square feet per Chickens.
- i. The coop and enclosed area must be kept clean and sanitary to prevent any insect breeding, vermin attraction, nuisance, or offensive odor past the property line.
- j. Dead birds and discarded or rotting eggs shall be removed as soon as possible but no longer than twenty four (24) hours and shall be properly disposed of.
- k. A Chickens permit must be obtained annually from the animal control office at the cost of five dollars (\$5.00) per year.
- l. The permit for keeping Chickens may be revoked upon the conviction of the permit holder of a violation of this section.
