WATER CONSERVATION TIPS

Water conservation measures are an important first step in protecting our water supply. Such measures not only save the supply of our source water, but can also save you money by reducing your water bill. Here are a few suggestions.

Conservation measures you can use inside your home include:

- ·Fix leaking faucets, pipes, toilets, etc. ·Replace old fixtures; install water-saving devices in faucets, toilets, and appliances.
- ·Wash only full loads of laundry. ·Do not use the toilet for trash disposal. ·Take shorter showers. ·Do not let the water run while shaving or brushing teeth. ·Soak dishes before washing. ·Run the dishwasher only when full.

You can conserve outdoors as well:

·Water the lawn and garden in the early morning or evening. ·Use mulch around plants and shrubs. ·Repair leaks in faucets and hoses. ·Use water-saving nozzles. ·Use water from a bucket to wash your car, and save the hose for rinsing.

MORE TIPS FOR A HEALTHY LAWN

How much is enough?

Before you can create an efficient watering schedule, you need to determine how much water your lawn is getting from your present method. This test will give you that information; it's based on measurements taken from different zones in your yard. A zone is a specific area of your landscape served by a series of sprinkler heads. Just follow these simple steps:

- 1. Set 3 or more flat bottom cans or coffee mugs at various places on your lawn at least 4 feet from the sprinkler heads.
- 2. Turn on the sprinkler(s) for 15 minutes.
- 3. Measure the depth of water in each can with a ruler and determine the average water depth in cans by adding up all the measurements and dividing by the number of cans used.
- 4. Match your sprinkler output with the table below. Then water as indicated:

Summer is upon us, and with it comes warmer weather, longer days, and an increase in property crimes. The summer months usually mark a high point for thefts and criminal mischief complaints in North Ogden. We would like to take this opportunity to remind \(\int \) everyone to lock up your property. We have had several bicycles stolen from yards and open garages recently. Residents have also reported items had been stolen from their vehicles. The common denominator between most of these cases is that the bicycle, garage or vehicle had been left unlocked. While a lock is not a crime preventer, it does act as a deterrent for many would be criminals. Please take the time to secure your property. Driving around at night, it is surprising how many garage and shed doors are left open. These openings not only allow criminals easy access to your valuable property, while at the same time, providing concealment so neighbors and passing police officers cannot see them, but these open doors also frequently allow the criminal easy access into the rest of your house. We encourage residents to walk around your property and look for unsecured access points into your house or garage and look for items that could be stolen. If you, as a law abiding citizen, can find things that a criminal could take, think of how easy it is for actual criminals to find targets. We also strongly encourage residents to note the serial numbers of items in your house, as well as the serial numbers of bicycles, lawn mowers, and any other equipment or toys you may have. These numbers are vital for investigations and insurance reporting, should the property be stolen. We often come across theft and burglary suspects, but are unable to match the property we believe to have been stolen with the victim, because the victim had been unable to provide the serial number for the stolen property. Finally, if you see something suspicious, or believe a crime may be, or is about to occur, do not hesitate to call us. Please help us keep North Ogden a safe and secure community by securing your property and reporting crime immediately, so together we can reduce the likelihood that you will be a criminal's next victim.



March Recycling Benefits for North Ogden

In February we recycled 70 tons of aluminum, cardboard/paper, scrap metals, and plastics.

These recycling efforts conserved the following resources:

- ❖ 1,126 Mature Trees were Saved Representing enough saved timber resources to produce more than 13,945,900 sheets of newspaper!
- 275 Cubic Yards of Landfill Airspace Representing enough airspace to fulfill the municipal waste disposal needs for 352 people for one year!
- 321,856 Kw-Hrs of Electricity from Recycling Enough power to fulfill the annual electricity needs of more than 26 homes!
- 161 Barrels of Oil Representing enough energy to heat and cool more than 33 homes for one year!
- Avoided 533 Metric Tons (MTCO2E) of GHG Emissions The recycling of these materials prevented these GHG emissions!
- ❖ 469,630 Gallons of Water Representing enough fresh water to meet the daily fresh water needs of more than 6,261 people!

NORTH OGDEN PROPOSITION 1

It is proposed that for the purpose of acquiring land, constructing, furnishing and equipping a public works complex, North Ogden City issue utility revenue bonds in an amount not to exceed \$7,000,000., bearing an interest rate not to exceed 6% per annum, to mature in not more than 30 years, to be sold at a price not less than 97% of the principal amount, pledging net revenue from water, sewer, storm water and garbage fees to secure payment of the bonds.
