ELECTION DAY

7AM – 8PM

In order to vote, voters must present valid voter identification.

This is either a form of identification that bears the name and photograph of the voter or two forms of identification that bear the name of the voter and provide evidence of the voter's residence.

In Utah, these forms of identification include:

1. A currently valid Utah driver license;
2. A currently valid ID card issued by the state or a branch, department, or agency of the United States;
3. A currently valid Utah permit to carry a concealed weapon;
4. A currently valid United States passport; or
5. A valid tribal ID card, whether or not the card includes a photograph of the voter.

Or

TWO forms of identification that bears the name of the voter and provide evidence that the voter resides in the voting precinct, which may include:

1. A current utility bill or copy thereof dated within 90 days before the election;
2. A bank or other financial account statement, or legible copy thereof;
3. A certified birth certificate;
4. A valid Social Security card.

HOW SNOW IS REMOVED FROM CITY STREETS

Again, the Public Works Department, along with the Police and
Fire Departments and the City Manager have been working on
preparation for this year’s snow and ice removal. This article is to
help us all better understand the procedure the city will be using.
Because we do not know when or how much snow we will receive,
we follow a basic plan for removal and adjust accordingly. If a storm
hits during the night, the Police Department will call out the crew as
needed.

Obviously, certain streets of the City
have a greater intensity of use and more
snow than other streets; these have a
higher priority. A map of the city
showing the route priority can be seen
at the City Office or City Shops. We
will plow the main routes first, school
areas, bus routes, etc, then we will
branch out into residential areas. It may be necessary to clear an area
immediately for power outages, fire or ambulance calls, or other
obvious emergencies. We have eight sanders and it does take time to
cover the entire City so we ask your help in being patient and driving
safely. As the plows cover the City it will take the plow at least three
passes on each street to clear the snow back to the curb. Please be
patient in cleaning your driveways. When clearing your driveway,
please put the snow on the right side of your driveway so when the
plows do come by they will push the snow away from your
driveway.



We especially want to draw your attention to the busy intersections
throughout the city. Please be extremely cautious when approaching
them. Slow down ahead of time, even if your lane has the right-of-
way. Your caution while traveling these and all areas of the city is
very important for your safety.

We understand that snow removal is a very time consuming and
frustrating task, not understanding the snowplow driver’s intentions
may add to that frustration. If you have any questions on how we do
snow plowing or salting, please call Mel at 782-8111. The
snowplow drivers cannot stop plowing to handle concerns unless an
emergency occurs. All questions and concerns will be turned over to
Mel, or the police officer on duty.

We will do our best to serve you and make North Ogden City a safe
winter community. Thank you for your support and caution.

SNOW REMOVAL HELP

Many of your friends, family members and neighbors are
older, temporarily or permanently disabled and need
your help when it snows. If you are willing to help your
neighbors, let them know. Give them your phone
number and tell them to call. If you are one of the
residents that are in need of assistance, talk to your
neighbors, know the phone numbers to your local church
leaders and scout masters.

A FEW MORE TIPS ON SNOW REMOVAL:

We begin plowing snow when there is an accumulation
of 3” or more. For those storms that are less than 3” we
will salt the main road, large hills and school zones only.

With a storm that lays down 3” of snow and then stops
it will take approximately 8 hours for the plows to clear
the snow from every area in the City but if the snow
continues beyond 3” the time is increased roughly 2
hours per inch. Please know that we are doing our best
to meet the snow removal needs of the city as quickly as
possible. Please be patient in cleaning your driveways
and do not put your snow in the roadways as this creates
a road hazard. When clearing your driveway, please put
the snow on the right side of your driveway so when the
plows do come by they will push the snow away from
your driveway. Also, please remember there is no
parking on any city street from midnight to 6:00 am or
within 24 hours of a snowstorm.

We ask your help in being patient and driving safely.
Please be sure that your vehicles have proper
maintenance and that you
decrease your speeds.

The North Ogden Police Department would like to thank our citizens for everything they do to help keep our neighborhoods safe from crime. Vigilant neighbors who are willing to watch out for each other and report suspicious activities help prevent crime before it happens. If the police are contacted by alert citizens, they can contact the would-be criminals before property is stolen or damaged, or before our neighbors’ lives are put in turmoil by those who seek to cause trouble. As we prepare our property for the winter months, please make sure that lawn mowers, bicycles and other outdoor equipment are put away and secured for the season. When you do this, we encourage everyone to take an extra moment and make note of the makes, models and serial numbers of all of your belongings, both inside and outside the house. Then, store this information in a safe location, if possible, off-site in a safe deposit box, at work, or with a trusted family member. This information is invaluable in the event your property is stolen, and can often be used to assist the police in apprehending suspects and getting your stolen property back to you. It is also helpful information when filing insurance claims in the event of damage or theft. If the property does not have a serial number listed, mark or engrave it with a person identification number such as your phone number, address, or driver’s license number (please, do not use your Social Security Number). Then, store these numbers as you would the serial numbers.



Finally, snow is just around the corner, and we would like to remind everyone that North Ogden has a Winter Parking ordinance, which prohibits parking on any public roadway between midnight and 6:00 A.M. between November 15th and March 15th. This ordinance also prohibits parking on a public roadway during or for 24 hours after a snow storm. This ordinance allows snow plows to safely remove snow from our streets. It is also unlawful to fail to promptly remove snow from a public sidewalk in front of your property, or to discharge snow from your property onto a public roadway.

We thank you for helping keep our community safe for both yourselves and others, and we hope you have a safe and enjoyable holiday season.

COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM

The North Ogden CERT program has several activities in the works. Beginning in January, we will be offering CERT training classes to all trained CERT members and any other residents who would like to be prepared in the event of an emergency. We plan to hold these classes quarterly, and they will cover a myriad of topics. We know there are a lot of residents who have been trained in the CERT program, and this is an excellent opportunity to freshen up those skills you already have. It is also a great opportunity for others to learn new skills. We are also in the process of incorporating social media into our emergency preparedness and CERT programs to provide citizens with updates on emergency preparedness training and tips, as well as up-to-date information in the event of an emergency. Please contact the NOPD at 801-782-7219 for training dates, or check back in next month’s newsletter for updates. Finally, we are also in the initial planning stages for next year’s Shake Out emergency response drill, tentatively scheduled for April, 2013. More information will be made available as we near that date. Come join us. With our location nestled along the base of Ben Lomond, North Ogden has the potential to experience a myriad of disasters ranging from winter storms and floods to earthquakes and wildfires. We are also not immune to such phenomena as tornados. Because of this potential, the North Ogden encourages all residents to be prepared. We never know when the next disaster will strike, and when the water comes flowing off the mountain, it is too late to start making those preparations.

As we approach the winter season and the temperatures start to dip down, we urge you to use safety when heating your home. Here are some safety tips for furnace safety:

- Keep the area around your furnace clean and unobstructed.
- Keep the burner area of your furnace clean.
- **DO NOT** allow anything combustible within six inches of your vent pipe.
- **DO NOT** close off more than 20% of your registers in your home, doing so can cause high resistance and unnecessary heat buildup in your furnace.
- **DO NOT** store combustible liquid such as paint thinners or gasoline near your furnace.

For those of you who use a fireplace or stove to heat your house the following are safety tips for you:

- Make sure to have your fireplace and chimney inspected and cleaned annually by a certified chimney specialist.
- Clear the area around the hearth of debris, decorations, or flammable materials.
- Always use a metal mesh screen on fireplaces that don't have a glass fireplace door.
- Never leave a fire unattended. Extinguish a fire before you go to bed or leave the house.
- Soak ashes in water and leave in a metal bucket outside, away from your house.



Whether you use a furnace or a fireplace to heat your home we strongly recommend the installation of smoke detectors and Carbon Monoxide detectors. Change the batteries twice a year and clean and test them once a month. Also practice your fire escape plan with your family to ensure that everybody knows what to do in case of a fire.

LOCAL BUSINESS OWNERS WIN BIG AT CHERRY DAYS

The North Ogden Business Alliance (NOBA) was founded in 2006 by a group of businesses that saw the need for a truly local association, similar to the Chamber of Commerce, but specifically tasked with addressing the needs of our North Ogden business community. The Alliance's first order of business was to work proactively with North Ogden City to create a partnership designed to foster business growth and attract new business to North Ogden. Ever wish your favorite store or restaurant would move to your area? The best way to attract these new businesses is for people to look at our community and see a strong thriving business district.

Soon after, the group introduced the **Spend It In North Ogden** campaign. This program's main goal is to encourage our neighbors to Shop Local. For every \$100 spent at a locally owned business, \$73 stays in the local economy, creating jobs, and paying for services like schools, public safety, and libraries. This is compared to \$43 that is returned back to the community for every \$100 spent at non-local businesses. The domino effect is now more of our neighbors have those dollars to spend local again and again. On average, a dollar that gets spent local may be re-spent locally 4-8 times!

Another thought...for every \$100 dollars spent locally, \$1 goes directly to the city budget. If a typical family spending \$1000 per month on groceries, gas, gift services and retail products were to shift that spending to businesses in their city it would result in \$100 going to the city. If 2000 families made that same move, it would result in more than \$20,000 into the city fund that does not have to come from property taxes!

Members of the Alliance have been appointed to the City's Economic Development Committee (EDC) where they have worked to change many of the existing ordinances that were outdated. The NOBA has become an integral part of North Ogden, the Cherry Days celebration, parade and more. In conjunction with the city NOBA has successfully installed banners along the business corridor and published a recurring message in the city newsletter.
