MAYOR'S MESSAGE

The end of the year is always a good opportunity to look back over what has happened, and 2015 was a great year for North Ogden City. During the budget process the City Council allocated additional funds for much needed road maintenance and for new snow plows that have greatly improved our plow service. We completed the new Public Works Facility without debt and this facility will serve our city for decades to come. We also completed a new Dog Park on 2600 North and are making plans for a larger Dog Park in another location. We also built a new restroom for Orton Park/Green Acres Elementary. We put an older, unused water well in Lakeview Heights, back into service, at a fraction of the cost of digging a new well. We completed a new General Plan that lays out a vision for development of our City after an exhaustive and collaborative process that involved input and participation from more than 1,000 residents. North Ogden PD was one of the first Departments statewide to implement body cameras on all officers. We launched a completely new website that makes it easier than ever for web visitors and participated in the completion of a new trailhead and new trails for the Bonneville Shoreline Trail above the City. We held the first annual City Pride Spring Clean-Up, and also won the first annual North Ogden – Pleasant View Cherry Days Softball game.

North Ogden was also recognized by several independent, outside entities for the high quality of life we enjoy, including the Utah Taxpayer's Association for having the 5th lowest "Cost of Government" among Utah Cities, by the Libertas Institute for being the 6th "Freest City" in Utah, and by the Safewise Report as the 8th "Safest City in Utah." All of these accomplishments have been a team effort, and I want to recognize and thank the North Ogden City Council, Employees, and Residents who have been involved in making this a fantastic year for our City. We have a lot more planned, and 2016 will be even better!

LEARN CPR

You Can Do It!

Bystander CPR Class - *No Cost* | January 27th, 2015, 6:30 p.m.
 North Ogden Senior Center | 485 E. 2550 N., North Ogden

According to a June, 2015 study published in the New England Journal of Medicine, a person in cardiac arrest who receives CPR, or cardiopulmonary resuscitation, from a bystander before emergency medical services (EMS) arrive is twice as likely to be alive a month later as someone who did not get bystander CPR.

On January 27th, North Ogden City will be hosting a free CPR class for any residents interested in learning this life-saving skill. A representative from Ogden Regional Medical Center will be teaching the proper techniques for performing effective cardiopulmonary resuscitation. Please note that this is not a certification course, but the information provided, and the opportunity to practice these skills can save a life.

North Ogden recently experienced a winter storm that resulted in several traffic incidents, including 25 vehicle slide-offs and nine crashes in a three hour period. We would like to remind residents of a few safety tips to stay safe in inclement weather.

- Slow down. Even all-wheel drive vehicles have difficulty on slick roads.
- Give yourself extra stopping distance between you and the vehicle in front of you.
- Begin to brake early to give time for anti-lock brakes to take effect.
- Check your tires. Balding tires may not have adequate traction on wet or snow-covered roads.
- Clear the windows and roof of your vehicle before leaving. Snow on the roof of your vehicle may slide down onto your windshield and obstruct your view.
- Keep an emergency kit in your vehicle with blankets, food, water and other items you will need if you become stranded.
- Keep sidewalks in front of your house clear of snow and ice.
- Do not discharge snow into the road. When this snow turns to ice it creates a road hazard.
- Keep areas around fire hydrants free of snow and make sure your house address is visible.
- Between November 15th and March 15th, do not park vehicles or trailers on the road overnight, during or within 24 hours after a snow storm. This gives plow operators time to remove snow from the road.

PUBLIC WORKS DIVISIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

STREETS

Street maintenance and repair, sidewalk and curb maintenance, street sign installation and maintenance, traffic line and legend installation and maintenance.

CULINARY WATER

Collection, treatment and distribution water to the entire city. Operates within the strict federal guidelines. Acknowledged as one of the best water systems in the state.

SANITARY SEWER

Maintains the City's system of sewer lines, cleaning of sewer lines, recording lines for maintenance and repair needs.

STORM DRAIN

Drain line inspection and maintenance, maintenance and grooming of all the City's detention basins, monitoring and control runoff waters.

SOLID WASTE

Delivery and pick up of all receptacles, maintenance, repair and replacement of receptacles. Refuse collection is contracted to Republic Services. For questions or concerns with Republic Services please call 801-781-1349.

FLEET MAINTENANCE

Maintenance and repair of the City-owned vehicles from small tools, such as, weed eaters and lawnmowers to the largest equipment, like the dump trucks, backhoe and loader.

ADMINISTRATION

Supervision of all projects in all divisions within the Public Works Department. Additionally, all the paperwork generated is funneled through this division for recording and tracking.

Guidelines to Ensure Consistent Service

- Service will be delayed one day after New Year’s Day, Memorial Day, Labor Day and Thanksgiving.
- Recycle containers that have trash in them will **NOT** be dumped as recycling and called into the city.
- All containers **MUST** be placed outside by **7 a.m.**
- Containers should be placed in the street with the wheels against the curb or within **2 feet** of blacktop with the front of the container facing the street.
- The container must be placed **4 feet** apart from other containers and **8 feet** from mailboxes, poles, fences, trees, or parked vehicles for easy access.
- Please **break down** cardboard boxes.
