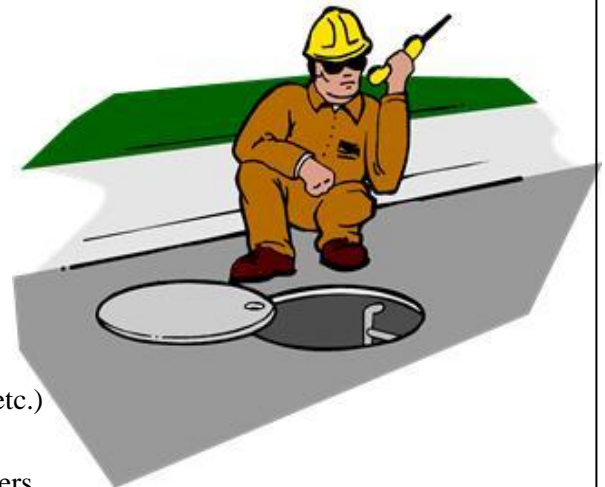

SEWER BACKED UP? What to do if a backup occurs – First, take action to protect people and valuable property. You may call the City at 782-8111 and as a courtesy service we will check the main sewer line in a timely manner. Any blockages found in the main lines will be promptly cleared. If the main line is not blocked, we recommend that you call a plumbing or sewer contractor to check your lateral line. Maintenance and repair of the lateral serving the home is the homeowner's responsibility.

Cleanup of the home should be done as soon as possible to minimize damage and possible negative health effects. There are qualified local businesses that specialize in this type of clean up.

BACK UP PREVENTION – Taking notice of what is flushed down toilets and sinks can prevent most backups. **DO NOT** flush the following materials (or similar items) down toilets/drains. These items can plug the main and cause damage to you and other property owners connected to the main.

- Large quantities of toilet paper
- Paper towels
- Feminine napkins (plastic applicators)
- Disposable diapers
- Clothing-socks, underwear, etc.
- Plastic, metal, wood, etc.
- Large quantities of cereals or grains (they can swell with water)
- Live seeds, beans, and peas (they may sprout)
- Grease, fats, oils
- Sponges, scouring pads, shop rags
- Fibrous materials (cotton balls, Q-tips, baby wipes, hair, cigarette butts, etc.)
- Sand

GREEN WASTE PICK-UP

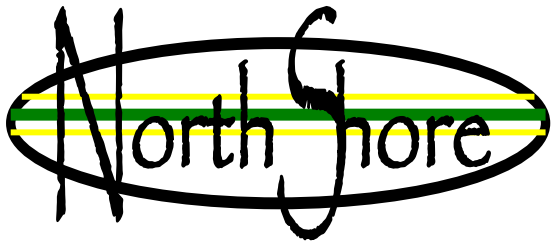


The City has scheduled the fall Green Waste Pick-Up for October 15-19, 2012; collection will be on your regular garbage day. The volume of material may; however, delay collection. The regulations mentioned below must be followed when placing material out for collection. All materials must be in bags, boxes or containers. Bush clippings and small tree limbs must be bundled and no longer than 5 feet in length. Weight limit is 75 pounds. Place materials in parkways, not in curb or waterways. **This is a Green Waste Pick-Up Only.**

We appreciate citizen participation and encourage your use of the compost facility. For that reason the **compost facility will be open for your use at NO CHARGE the entire clean-up week (Mon –Fri) from 8am to 4:30pm and Saturday from 9am to noon.**

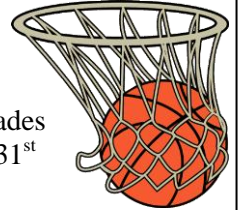

LEAF COLLECTION

We have added a leaf collection truck to our fleet. This interesting looking truck has a large hose on the side and a strong vacuum. We are able to drive along the curb and suck up leaves. We are still trying to work out a schedule that allows us to best serve the needs of residents. We also have to take into consideration inclement weather and also work around garbage days. At this time we are going to try the following schedule:

If your garbage day is... Friday we will be around with the leaf collector on... Monday
Monday Tuesday
Tuesday Wednesday
Wednesday Thursday
Thursday Friday



If you would like to take advantage of using the leaf collection truck please rake your leaves to the park strip area (this is the area between the sidewalk and curb). Please make sure that this area is free of mailboxes and trees as the arm needs to be free to swing to and fro. DO NOT pile your leaves in an area that is landscaped with small rocks as the leaf collector has a very strong vacuum and the rocks will be sucked up and damage the truck.

Please understand that heavy rain or snow will prevent us from using the leaf collector. You can choose to leave the leaves at the curb for the next scheduled day or you can bag them up instead.

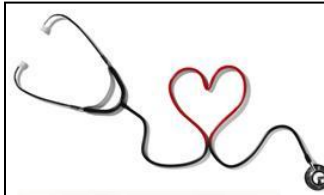

The North Ogden Police Department would like to remind residents to secure their property. This summer, residents have reported over one hundred thefts in North Ogden. The majority of these stolen items have been from garages that have been left open or vehicles that have been left unlocked. We have also had several incidents where batteries and propane tanks have been stolen from camp trailers and recreational vehicles. Many of these thefts could have been prevented, had residents taken the time to lock their property. It only takes seconds to deter these criminals. Unfortunately, it also only takes a matter of seconds for a criminal to take your valuables. Please invest those extra seconds necessary to protect your property. We also strongly encourage residents to record the make, model and serial numbers of items around their homes. Please note the item information for cameras, computers, televisions, bicycles, lawn mowers, snow blowers and other home electronics and other valuable property. Keep this documentation in a secure location, preferably away from the house, such as a safe deposit box or a trusted family member's home. It is often difficult to return stolen property to its rightful owner without proof that the recovered item is the actual item stolen.



School is back in session. As a result, children are out walking and bicycling to and from school. Please be extra cautious while driving, especially when children are present. These children can often be difficult to see, and we ask for your assistance in preventing a tragedy. We also ask that you be extra cautious around school crossing zones. In addition to the school zones that have been utilized in past years, there is also a new school crossing at 550 E 2650 N in front of North Ogden Elementary School. Please remember that the speed limit is 20 miles per hour anytime the school crossing lights are in operation. Drivers are required to follow the directions of the crossing guard, and must remain stopped until the children and crossing guard are off the roadway.

It's not too late to register for the Green Choices Challenge!

If you have not signed up yet to participate in the challenge please take a few minutes to do so. The challenge runs through the end of the year so there is still plenty of time!

Once you are registered you will simply need to log on or call in weekly to report that you have recycled. Waste Management picks up the blue recycle cans every other week but every time you place recyclable materials in the can you are recycling so report your participation weekly.

RecycleBank tracks the participation of our residents each week only when you report online or by phone. Participation is not ranked by weight or the number of blue cans that are picked up.

Remember North Ogden City is competing with 49 other communities from around the country for a **\$100,000 grant!**



If you've watched the news this summer, you are likely aware of the large number of wildfires that have affected our state. Several of the news stories focused on the residents who were forced to evacuate and the emergency shelters set up to assist those displaced residents. Those shelters were most likely staffed by volunteers associated with the areas' local Community Emergency Response Team or CERT. Closer to home, North Ogden's CERT played an integral part in another successful Cherry Days celebration. They also assisted in the evacuation of a neighborhood in the City that was threatened by a fire on the hillside above the homes. These CERT members are our neighbors; they volunteer to assist in emergencies and other special events. They also receive training in their areas of interest and are then available to be called upon to assist in a coordinated emergency response.
