Green Waste Facility Opening

The compost facility, located at 2700 North and Mountain Road, will open on April 2, 2012.

The hours of operation are:

Mondays and Wednesdays	3:00pm-6:00pm
Saturdays	9:00am-noon

It will be closed during hunting season and on all government holidays.

Green Waste passes will be sold to residents at the City Office. During office hours (9:00 am to 5:30 pm Monday thru Friday, except holidays) you may purchase a pass for \$25.00. The pass is good for 10 (non-consecutive) days.

ACCEPTED MATERIALS:

Woody Materials: vines, bushes, twigs, limbs, fitzers and logs up to 12" in diameter. Stumps are not accepted.

Compost Materials: soft (non-woody), unbagged vegetative material (i.e. Grass clippings, leaves, pine needles, sawdust and shavings, weeds, farm animal manure).

Fill Materials: soil, rock, sod, brick, block, asphalt and concrete (prior approval needed).

Materials not specifically listed above will not be accepted. The woody tree material will be chipped or ground.

Wood chips and mulch items will be available for pick up during the regular operating hours.

Please obey all signage at the compost facility to assure proper placement of items and assist in keeping the facility clean and organized. This program is operated entirely by volunteer residents of North Ogden. We thank the volunteers from last season and encourage you to be a volunteer this season. Without volunteers the facility doesn't operate. If you have any questions please contact Jim Wells at 782-8111.

DETENTION PONDS

We are fortunate to live in a city with such beautiful surroundings and spectacular views. With those mountains and views come hillside slopes, and steep grades, which require detention ponds to slow the flow of water from running out of the city too fast. There are over 30 detention ponds throughout the city and chances are that you may live close to one of them. We are asking your consideration and cooperation in maintaining those ponds by not using them for your refuse (limbs, grass, animal waste, etc). Your refuse causes added work for the 2-person maintenance team and limits the proper flow of water in the ponds. Thank you.

CURB AND GUTTER CLEANING

The Maintenance Department is working hard to keep the curb and gutters free of debris; however it is a never-ending task. There are 180 lane miles of road in our great city and it takes time to get to every mile. We ask for your patience and cooperation in this continuing effort. We would like to encourage each resident to sweep and bag the garbage from the section of curb and gutter in front of your homes. Any help you can give us will be greatly appreciated. If you bag the materials we will gladly pick it up for disposal, just call 782-8111.

Items that are not compost materials can be thrown into the dumpster located in the compost area. As you are aware, this facility is staffed only by volunteers. Another year has passed and spring is upon us. As the weather gets warmer I find myself getting a bug to get outside to do something in the outdoors. Usually for me that means heading out with my rod and reel and trying to catch some fish. Like most of you, before I can go out and have fun, I have certain things to accomplish. One of these things is getting my yard cleaned up from the past winter and fall.

Open burning permits are available to fill out at North Ogden City Offices or at North View Fire Station. Burning is only allowed during the month of April. After filling out the permit there are specific rules that you need to adhere to. These rules detach from the permit and are for your reference. You are required to follow these rules, but we also urge you to use common sense as well. Ultimately when you start the fire you are responsible for its control.

Open Burning Fire Safety Tips:

- 1) No use of accelerants such as gasoline.
- 2) Use protective eye wear and gloves.
- 3) Never leave your fire unattended and have a garden hose hooked up for a water supply.
- 4) All fires must be 50 feet or more from any structure.
- 5) All fires should be burned in the daylight hours and be extinguished by dark.
- 6) No trash of any kind should be burned.
- 7) Watch weather reports and plan accordingly, don't burn in windy conditions.

Spring and summer months are historically very active months for criminal activity in North Ogden. This is the time of year when we see an increase in thefts as well as graffiti and criminal mischief complaints, among other problems. As the weather gets warmer and the days get longer, people tend to venture out more often. Unfortunately, some of these people wandering about the city are looking to cause problems. We have already started to see an increase in criminal mischiefs and thefts from vehicles. Within the past two weeks, the city has experienced incidents where houses have been damaged, vehicle windows shattered, and fires started. As I write this, the North Ogden Police Department is also handling a number of thefts that occurred overnight last night. Suspects wandered throughout a large area of the city checking car doors. When they found a vehicle they could enter, they rummaged around for anything they could steal. It wasn't until the following morning, long after the criminals had left the area, that the victims learned that their personal space had been violated and their property taken.

Please be mindful of your property and your surroundings.

We want to remind everyone to lock your doors, windows and garages, put away and secure lawn mowers, bicycles and other outside equipment, and report suspicious incidents and people to the police department immediately at 801-629-8221.

When dealing with criminal incidents, minutes make a difference. Do not hesitate to report anything or anyone that seems suspicious. We would rather check on a suspicious person only to find they have a legitimate reason for being where they are and doing what they are doing than to learn after they've left the area that they were committing a crime. If a would-be criminal is contacted as he or she is contemplating committing a crime, that person will likely move on to safer pastures as they realize that the citizens of our community are observant, and that those citizens are in contact with the police.



Spring is traditionally the time when we also focus on our community outreach programs. Below is a list of upcoming safety programs. We invite all citizens to participate in these programs and to check the city website for updates.

- Saturday April 21st - 10am-3pm – Safe Kids Day Fair – Weber County Fair Grounds. Free bike helmets and t-shirts will be available while supplies last.
- Saturday April 28th – 10am-2pm – Smith's Food & Drug Prescription Disposal. This is an excellent opportunity to dispose of unused or expired medications. (There is also a drop box available in the lobby of the police department for this same purpose.)

Neighborhood/Park Watch meetings will be scheduled within the next couple of weeks. They will likely take place at our parks during the month of May. Check the city's website www.northogdencity.com for updates.
