Green Waste Facility Opening

The compost facility located at 2700 North and Mountain Road will open on April 2, 2011.

The hours of operation are:

Mondays and Wednesdays 3:00pm-6:00pm
Saturdays 9:00am-noon

It will be closed hunting season and all government holidays.

Green Waste passes will be sold to residents at the City Office. During office hours (9:00 am to 5:30 pm Monday thru Friday, except holidays) you may purchase a pass for \$25.00. The pass is good for 10 (non-consecutive) days.

ACCEPTED MATERIALS:

Woody Materials: vines, bushes, twigs, limbs, fitters and logs up to 12" in diameter. Stumps are not accepted.

Compost Materials: soft (non-woody), unbagged vegetative material (ie. Grass clippings, leaves, pine needles, sawdust and shavings, weeds, farm animal manure).

Fill Materials: soil, rock, sod, brick, block, asphalt and concrete (prior approval needed).

Materials not specifically listed above will not be accepted. The woody tree material will be chipped or ground.

Wood chips and mulch items will be charged as defined in the consolidated fee schedule and on the sheet you were given when you purchased your punch card. You may pick those items up during the mentioned operating hours.

Please obey all signage at compost facility to assure proper placement of items and assist in keeping the facility clean and organized.

This program is operated entirely by volunteer residents of North Ogden. We thank the volunteers from last season and encourage you to be a volunteer this season. Without volunteers the facility doesn't operate.

PARK RESERVATIONS

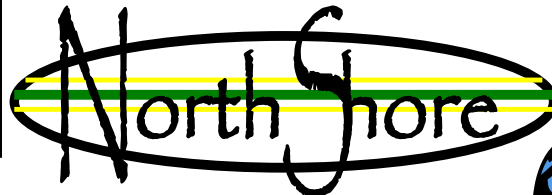
Reservations are being taken for the months of April through September 2011. Reservations must be made in person at the Community Services office. We are open weekdays between 9AM and 5:30PM.

We would like to start off by thanking the residents of North Ogden for their assistance this winter with snow removal and winter parking. We have noticed that, overall, our residents have done a great job of making sure that the sidewalks in front of their homes were cleared of snow. We have also noticed a reduction in winter parking violations, and would like to thank everyone for their assistance in keeping the roads clear of vehicles so our snow removal crews could effectively plow the roads.

As the weather warms and our focus turns toward yard work, we wish to remind everyone to keep trees trimmed up around road signs. These signs are often easy to see during the winter months through the bare trees, but once new tree growth and leaves appear, these same signs can easily disappear behind the foliage. Our road signs are intended to help keep our community safe, however, if the signs are obscured, they lose their effectiveness. Along these same lines, we strongly encourage residents to be mindful of the landscaping in their yards. Low hanging trees and shrubs make excellent hiding places for criminals who are either attempting to gain access into your homes or are otherwise involved in illegal activities. Please keep trees and shrubs trimmed back away from doors and windows. We recommend that you stand out by the road and look at your house. If you see areas where shrubbery conceals doors or windows, trim them back so the access-points can be seen from the road. Also, look at your house number. If the number is not clearly visible from the roadway, both day and night, please do what is necessary so that these numbers are easily located by emergency personnel if the need arises. As emergency responders, we know that lives are often dependent on our quick response, but our response times can be hindered by our inability to find the correct address because the house numbers are either too small, covered by shrubbery, blend in with the house color, or are simply non-existent.

Finally, the North Ogden Police Department is holding their semi-annual community meetings. These meetings are an excellent opportunity to discuss current crime trends in our community, and also provide residents with an opportunity to share their concerns with a representative of the North Ogden Police Department. The North Ogden Historical Museum board would like to commend the descendants of William Nathan Barker for their excellent restoration of the family's barn near 2400 Fruitland Drive, which was constructed in 1932. The Orloff Opheikens family is appreciated for preserving the historic value of the Enoch Randall barn near 1800 Fruitland Drive, built in 1900. North Ogden's early structures played an important part in our history and demonstrate the integrity of early craftsmanship. The "Images of America – North Ogden" pictorial history book is available from museum board members, as well as from the North Ogden City Offices.

We have been having several calls and complaints regarding the parking of boats, campers, and other recreational vehicles on one's property. If you have any questions on where these types of vehicles can be parked on your property please contact Bruce Higley at 801-940-7987 or Brandon Boydston at 801-940-2528.

If you are parking these types of vehicle on your grass or in your front yard plan on a visit from us.

Motor homes, travel trailers, camping trailers, other trailers and boats, shall not be located in the public street for more than two (2) consecutive days and not more than ten (10) days in any one month. No recreational vehicles may be stored in the public street during and twenty four (24) hours after the end of a snow storm. In multi-family developments and planned residential unit development projects, recreational vehicles shall only be parked in approved screened storage yards; however, occupancy of any vehicle in the storage yard is prohibited.

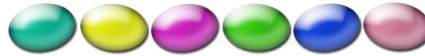
