ACCEPTED ITEMS

- Large Household trash items (furniture, mattresses, bed frames, etc.)
- Used tires and car batteries
- Green waste (branches, leaves, weeds, etc.)
- Paint (must be dried with kitty litter)
- Cardboard, plastic and glass
- Appliances and electronics
- Used oil will be accepted by **Jiffy Lube** and **Auto Zone**

NOT ACCEPTED

- *NO commercial waste or dumping*
- *Household garbage that belongs in your weekly garbage pick up*
- *Waste from residents of other cities*

As the temperatures warm up, we are seeing more pedestrians and bicyclists out enjoying the nice weather. We would like to remind everyone of a few rules to help keep everyone safe.

Motorists:

- Watch for pedestrians on or near the roadway. Many areas of the city do not have sidewalks, and pedestrians must walk in the street.
- If traffic ahead of you is stopped near a crosswalk, do not attempt to pass the other vehicles, as they may be stopped for pedestrians you cannot see.
- Watch out for pedestrians and bicyclists on or near the roadway. Bicyclists have the same rights, and must adhere to the same traffic rules as a motorist.
- Stop behind the white stop line when at a traffic signal or stop sign.
- Watch for, and follow the directions of school crossing guards.

Pedestrians:

- Whenever possible, cross the street at the corner, or at a controlled intersection. If there are orange flags available, utilize these to increase your visibility.
- Do not jay-walk.
- Do not enter the roadway to cross the street until you are confident that vehicle traffic sees you and has stopped for you.
- When walking in the street, walk single file to avoid impeding traffic.

Bicyclists:

- Wear a helmet and high-visibility clothing.
- Ride in the same direction as traffic, as close to the right shoulder as is safe, unless passing slower traffic, when making or preparing to make a left turn, or when proceeding straight through an intersection with a right turn lane.
- Adhere to the same laws as the operator of a motor vehicle, including at stop signs and other traffic control devices.
- Yield the right of way to pedestrians when riding on the sidewalk or on trails.
- Use headlights and taillights when riding from the period 30 minutes prior to dusk until the time 30 minutes after sunrise.

Remember, just because you may feel you have the right of way, does not mean you will not be injured or cause injury due to inattention. Please be safe.

FACTS ABOUT MOSQUITOES AND MOSQUITO CONTROL

- Did you know that there are 50 different species of mosquitoes found in the state of Utah, 176 species in the United States, and over 3,000 species worldwide?
- Only the female mosquito bites and takes blood meal. This is not for nourishment but to aid in egg production.
- Water that sits for more than a week has the possibility of becoming mosquito habitat. Empty or change water in bird baths, water troughs, small wading pools, and anything else around your home weekly.
- Always take precautions in preventing mosquito bites in the evening and early morning hours.
- Use mosquito repellent, wear long pants and long sleeve shirts during peak biting times, and mosquito proof your home by installing or repairing screens and draining standing water.
- CO2 (what we breathe out) is one of the primary attractants for mosquitoes.
- Smelly feet are attractive to mosquitoes.
- Blondes tend to be more attractive to mosquitoes than brunettes.
- A full moon increased mosquito activity 500%.

Sewer Backed Up?

If a backup occurs, take action to protect people and valuable property. You may call the city at 801-782-8111 and as a courtesy service we will check the main sewer line. Any blockages found in the main lines will be promptly cleared. If the main line is not blocked, we recommend you call a plumbing or sewer contractor to check your lateral line. Maintenance and repair of the lateral serving the home is the homeowner's responsibility. Clean up of the home should be done as soon as possible to minimize damage and possible negative health effects.

Take notice of what is flushed down toilets and sinks to prevent backups. **DO NOT** flush the following materials (or similar items) down toilets/drains. *Large quantities of toilet paper, Paper towels, Feminine napkins (plastic applicators), Disposable diapers, Clothing-socks, underwear, etc., Plastic, metal, wood, etc., Large quantities of cereals or grains (the can swell with water), Live seeds, beans, and peas (they may sprout), Grease, fats, oils, Sand, Fibrous materials (cotton balls, q-tips, baby wipes, hair, rags, cigarette butts, etc), Sponges, scouring pads, shop rags.*

DETENTION PONDS

We are fortunate to live in a city with its beautiful mountains and views. This also comes with hillsides, slopes, and steep grades, which require detention ponds to slow the flow of water from running out of the city too fast. There are over 30 detention ponds throughout the city and chances are that you may live close to one of them. Please help us maintain these ponds by not using them for your refuse (limbs, grass, animal waste, etc). Your refuse causes added work for the 2-person maintenance team and limits the proper flow of water in the ponds. Thank you.

SECONDARY (PINEVIEW) WATER

Pineview water is on for the season as of April 18th and once again we are asked to conserve water by not watering between 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m

CHANNEL / CANAL CLEANING

If you live near a channel or canal the City is asking that you take a moment to inspect the area to assure there is no debris that may cause a blockage near your property or downstream. If you clean out debris, from the canals, please bag it up and call the City at 801-782-8111 to have it picked up.

EARTHQUAKE COMING?

With the recent earthquakes in Japan and Ecuador, we would like to remind our residents that we are not immune to these types of disasters. North Ogden has an active earthquake fault running along the east and north of the city. According to a recent Salt Lake Tribune article, scientists are predicting that Utah has a 43 percent chance of experiencing a 6.75 magnitude earthquake within the next 50 years.
