USED OIL COLLECTION

North Ogden Public Works continues to accept used motor oil at the maintenance shop located at 332 East Pleasant View Dr. Oil will be accepted during regular business hours Monday-Friday 8:00am to 4:00pm. The oil must be free of any pollutants such as antifreeze, solvents, etc. Please DO NOT leave oil without contacting an employee and providing needed information. Oil that is left without the required information cannot be recycled. Thank you for helping keep North Ogden City environmentally safe.

The following statement applies ONLY to those who pay with a credit or debit card, either ONLINE or OVER THE PHONE. It does not apply to those who pay using a credit or debit card IN PERSON!

In order for the City to continue providing the service of allowing customers to pay with a credit or debit card, the City will now be charging a \$2.50 convenience fee for those who choose to pay for City services with a credit or debit card either online or over the phone. This fee will help offset nearly \$30,000 in expenses charged to the City by both the credit and debit card and card processing companies. Please remember that you will have the CHOICE of NOT paying the fee but you will then need to pay by some form of payment other than a credit or debit card. We apologize for the inconvenience but the City is trying to keep costs down for ALL citizens of the City.

Summer is quickly coming to a close, so we wish to take this time to focus on pedestrians. The schools in Weber School District begin the new year on August 23rd. Please be mindful in your travels that there will be an increase in pedestrian and bicycle traffic. Every year, North Ogden Police Department receives complaints of drivers not paying attention in school zones or where children are present. We also write numerous citations for drivers who either speed through school zones or do not stop for pedestrians in the crosswalks. Please remember that the speed limit is 20 miles per hour in a school zone, and that drivers must yield to pedestrians in the crosswalk. There is also a new state law requiring motorists to provide a three foot buffer between themselves and bicycles. We understand that people lead busy lives, but no appointment or cell phone call is worth the life of one of our children.

Along these same lines, we also wish to remind parents that now is an excellent time to speak with your children about their safety. Please remind your children to cross the street in the crosswalk, and where there is not a marked crosswalk, to cross at an intersection. Also, instruct them to look both ways and make sure it is safe before proceeding. Darting across the street is never safe, and doing so mid-block or between parked cars where motorists are not expecting them, is especially dangerous. Remind them to walk on the sidewalk, and where there is not a sidewalk, to walk along the shoulder of the road, off the pavement if possible. Also, encourage them to walk facing traffic. This is also a perfect opportunity to remind our children of other dangers associated with walking. Every year, children report being approached by strangers as they walk to or from school.



We know there is a certain element of our society that preys on the vulnerabilities of our youth. There is safety in numbers, and we ask that you encourage your children to walk in groups. Also, encourage them to report suspicious activity to you or their teachers immediately, and if they report a suspicious incident to you, please contact our dispatch center at 801-629-8221 so that these incidents can be investigated. If you would like to have a police officer assist you in speaking with your youth group about pedestrian and stranger safety, please contact our office at 801-782-7219. North Ogden and Waste Management are driving environmental performance with solutions that manage and minimize waste, while recycling valuable resources and creating clean renewable energy.

JUNE 2011 REPORT

Below is a snapshot of data collected regarding North Ogden solid waste collection and recycling activities for the month:

TONNAGE DATA

Solid Waste: 793.60 Tons
Recycling: 111.10 Tons
Total: 904.70 Tons



Total Waste Diverted from Landfill: 111.10 Tons or 12.28%

Estimated Environmental Benefit based on single stream recycling tonnage:

- ✓ Saved 1,800 trees which equates to 22,000,000 sheets of newspaper.
- ✓ Saved 455,000 KW-hr of electricity. Enough power for the annual energy needs of 30 homes.
- ✓ Saved 51,000 gallons of oil. Enough energy to heat and cool more than 200 homes annually.
- ✓ Saved 2,600 gallons of gasoline.
- ✓ Saved 777,000 gallons of water.

NORTH OGDEN PARKS

Reservations for North Ogden parks can be made online at www.northogdencity.com, or you can come into the Community Services office during regular business hours.

We currently have eight different parks that can be reserved. Reservation times are 8 am – 1 pm, 2 pm – 10 pm, or all day. The rental time includes all set-up, take-down, and clean-up.

We would like to remind everyone that will be using the city parks this summer of a few guidelines:

- No fires except in grills or fire pits. Use only charcoal in the grills. Portable propane grills are allowed. Pick up all garbage and remove all table covers.
- Do not park on the lawn.
- There is a noise ordinance in the city (no excessively loud music) and there is a curfew which is 10 pm.
- No alcoholic beverages and no smoking in the parks.
- No Slip and Slides, ice blocking, or other activities that will damage the grass. You must provide us with information on the application and insurance if you having a bounce house.

We have added new basketball and volleyball courts at North Ogden Park. We hope you enjoy our beautiful parks this year.
